Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! The last weeks have been extremely busy. After travelling to Lima Peru and on to Toronto, we arrived December 16th at our hotel in Barrie at 1 a.m. That day I renewed my driver 's licence, arranged car insurance and got the utilities put into my name. The next day we moved into a townhouse in Orillia that the Lord had provided for our time here. Praise the Lord!

We were able to spend Christmas Eve with my Mom and Susan's family and then again with Dawson and Ruby as well on the 26th. It was planned for the 25th, but we were snowed in until the tractor cleared our road late in the afternoon. It has been lovely to spend time with family that we have not seen for over 5 years. Grace was particularly excited, exclaiming, "This is my first time seeing you! This is my first time!"

It is also Grace's first time seeing snow and she loves playing in it. She had fun tobogganing for the first time yesterday! She also enjoyed her first day of kindergarten. However, as much as she likes Canada she also misses her home and friends in Bolivia and occasionally gets very upset that she cannot go to her "other house". Please also pray that we can work out the ongoing situation with the judge. A lawyer for the provincial government is straightening things out. Once that happens we will be able to receive more children. Pray also for the parents for the boys' home. There is a pastor and his wife who are interested, and pray for God's guidance as to whether or not they are the right people for this ministry.

In the last months before returning to Canada we were able to make several visits to the Machineri and the two Yaminawa villages. All of the three Christian couples we knew in the Yaminawa villages had fallen into sin during the years of the pandemic when nobody visited them to encourage them. One of those couples has rededicated their lives to the Lord. Together with another lady who lives part-time in the village and part-time in the city they are trying to start a Good News Club with materials that we are providing. It is hard though because they do not know how to read very well (and cannot even write their names).

In the Machineri village, we were not able to communicate with the former chief who had received the Lord as his Saviour because he has been living recently in Brazil. However, the new chief who came from Peru is a Christian (the only one in the village). Jose was able to baptize his wife Sarai, and we had hoped to marry them as well but could not coordinate it on time with the civil authorities. The chief, Fermin, is trained as a school teacher and after talking with us felt that his purpose for coming to Bolivia was to start a Good News Club in his village. We gave him some brief training and are providing him with materials for that purpose. For now, only his own children are attending but we are encouraging him to continue, trusting that other children will start attending. Pray that God will soften the hearts of the parents of the other children so that they might be allowed to attend.
